INTRODUCTION

The RSET IEDC (Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Center), is one of the leading IEDCs in all of Kerala, funded and headed by the Kerala Startup Mission. The primary goal of RSET IEDC is to foster innovation, creativity, and entrepreneurial skills among students, leading to the development of socially relevant projects and the prototyping of these projects. With the help of faculty mentors, the IEDC plans, trains, and monitors student activities in their respective departments, with the ultimate objective of helping students secure funding and incubation opportunities for their projects.

The vision of RSET IEDC is to become a self-sustaining Technology Business Incubator (TBI) that caters to the needs of young student entrepreneurs with innovative ideas of social relevance. The mission is to create an ecosystem that enables students and faculty to innovate and prototype their potential ideas with industrial standards and support from government, industry, and reputed academic institutions worldwide.

The objectives of RSET IEDC include designing and developing innovative products of social relevance, creating an entrepreneurial culture among faculty, students, and alumni, and supporting other institutions to carry out entrepreneurial activities effectively. The IEDC also aims to encourage innovation-driven entrepreneurship from student projects, promote start-up initiatives, and mold students to complete their engineering studies with all the entrepreneurial skill sets required to become successful personalities. The short-term goals of RSET IEDC include helping student groups prototype their ideas, improving innovation, creative and design thinking, and organizing various workshops, seminars, and talks to promote an entrepreneurial culture. The long-term goals include generating revenues through consultancy work and student start-ups, associating with leading academic institutions worldwide, and providing a platform for students to develop innovative products with global recognition.

Attendees left with a solid understanding of Arduino programming, and expressed interest in future workshops and starting their own projects.





DAY 2

The entrepreneurship workshop on 3D printing for 24 students from Cochin Refineries School was led by Femin Francis and covered 3D modeling, hardware, and printing processes. These workshops can develop skills in design, engineering, and CAD, and encourage creativity and problem-solving. The students found the workshop valuable.

ENTREPRENEURIAL EVENTS

Entrepreneurial events conducted by RSET IEDC aims to promote & encourage to instill the entrepreneurial culture among the students. These events aim to provide a platform for aspiring entrepreneurs to showcase their innovative ideas, learn from experts in the field, and network with like-minded individuals. These events are open to students from all departments and offer opportunities for students to receive guidance and support in starting their own ventures.

EVENT DETAILS

1. Thinkverse of Designs

The "Thinkverse of Design" workshop was a 2 day design thinking program, with 100 participants in attendance. The event was held on the 13th and 14th of June, 2022. The workshop was presided by Mr. Vishnu Nagaraj, Founder and CEO, Carve Startup Labs. Mr.Georgin Gently and Mr.Ajoe Joseph coordinated the event. The workshop aimed at providing students insights on building creative minds. It included events that focused on ideation, product development, and business modelling on day one. On day

two, the events focused on target customers, target areas, and scaling the business. Overall, The session was helpful in introducing the design thinking concept.



2. SALT

The SALT was a 2 day Startup Awareness and Leadership program conducted by the members of Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre of Rajagiri School of Engineering and Technology in collaboration with Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and Bhavan's Varuna Vidyalaya on 15th and 16th of July, 2022. The sessions consisted of 5 modules, with 22 students from Bhavan's Varuna Vidyalaya under the guidance of Principal Ms. Ramadevi K P and Vice Principal Ms. Sreedevi A and 17 speakers from RSET IEDC including Nodal Officer Mr. Nitheesh Kurian, Assistant nodal officer Ms. Anu Maria Joykutty and Ms. Anila Kuriakose. The event was coordinated by Keyaa Peter and Amal Radhakrishnan. The sessions consisted of 5 modules focusing on Team Formation, Brainstorming and Ideation, Building a Plan, Marketing & Networking and Presentation & Pitch. 


4. Pinnacle Tales



5. Decoding Social Entrepreneurship

The 3rd session was delivered by Ms Aisha Nazia, Co-Founder, Ready sports about team management. The 4th and 5th sessions focused on fundraising for social impact startup and the concept of fail fast and fail often. The sessions were delivered by Mr Abhishek Agarwal, Managing Partner, Accion Impact Investment and Mr Rohit Joseph Mathew, Product Analyst, Refyne respectively. Mr Daniel Jeevan,

Head of Operations- SCSCT at STEAG Energy Services (India) Pvt. Ltd, delivered a session about Storytelling and Pitching on Day 6. The boot camp ended with a networking session on Day 7.



6. ExpIEDCion

ExpIEDCion was an orientation program conducted on 2nd November 2022 focusing on innovation in collaboration with RSET IIC. 
17. SALT (SOS Aluva)

TECHNICAL EVENTS

Technology events conducted by RSET IEDC are opportunities provided to students of all years to participate and experience various programs that provide technological literacy and insight into the expanding technical world. These events provide students with workshops, presentations and competitions related to cutting-edge technologies, engineering, computer science and robotics. The technological events conducted provide a unique opportunity for participants to expand their technical knowledge, learn about emerging trends, and connect with others who are interested in the same domain.

EVENT DETAILS

1. Code Drill

Code Drill was a two-day coding competition that was hosted by RSET IEDC from 17 July 2022 to 18 July 2022. The event was coordinated by Mr.Abinav Anil Sunish and Ms.Neha Bimal. Day-1 of the event was held on the online platform HackerRank on 17 July 2022 from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM, with 31 participants in

attendance. Day-2 of the event was held at Rajagiri School of Engineering and Technology (Autonomous), from 4:45 PM to 5:00 PM, with the top ten individuals participating in the event. The event aimed to enhance participants' skills in programming by offering an opportunity to solve various problems with efficiency and accuracy. Overall, the Code Drill event was a success and provided participants with an opportunity to network with others while enhancing their coding skills. The event was conducted exclusively for RSET students and the winners were awarded with certificates of excellence and goodies like airdopes and gaming mouse. 3. Once Upon A Time








2. MasterClasses (Finance)

7. MasterClasses (Creative)



feedback and generating interest in their products. Overall, KITE was an excellent opportunity for students to showcase their offerings and gain visibility & popularity in the market.








11. Forge: Ideas to Market (Headstart)







14. Makerfest
